HATTERSLEY'S POLICING team commenced Operation Dragon in mid September, which aims to drive out youth nuisance. Thanks to additional funding, officers from other neighbourhood police teams have been drafted in to take part in the operation that will run from September till the end of October.

Extra resources to deal with youth nuisance

PC Sue Moss and I will guide the extra resources to the hot spots for anti social behaviour in the area. The operation will gather intelligence about who is causing problems and where alcohol is involved it will be confiscated. We also anticipate making arrests, which will reinforce the message that the community will not put up with drunken, rowdy behaviour by a small minority of the area's young people.

We need parents support

Youth nuisance is everyone's problem and we are asking parents to work with us by being more aware of where their children are and what they are up to. Alcohol is often fuel to the fire with youth nuisance and we are also asking parents to check the condition of their children when they return home to see if they have been drinking. All young people stopped as part of the operation will have their details recorded and where

appropriate they will be referred to the Community Safety team and their housing provider will also be informed.

Lets us know where the problems are

We want residents who have concerns or information on the area's hot spots or where alcohol is being sold to underage young people, to give my team a call on 0161 856 9493 and let us know. All calls will be treated in the strictest confidence and can be made anonymously if you are happier to do it that way.

Car crime - targeting known offenders

We want to reassure residents that we are aware of the recent spate of vehicle crime on the estate and that measures are in place to target known offenders. We have also increased visible patrols. Again we ask that if you have any information on the people responsible that you give either myself or Sue Moss a call on 0161 856 9493.

AS PART OF a recent health awareness week held in September, local residents in Hattersley have been getting involved with the campaign 'Know Your Numbers'.

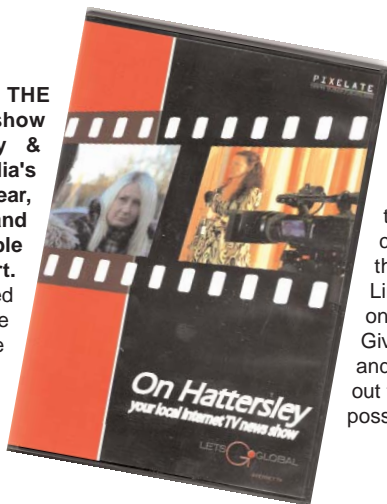

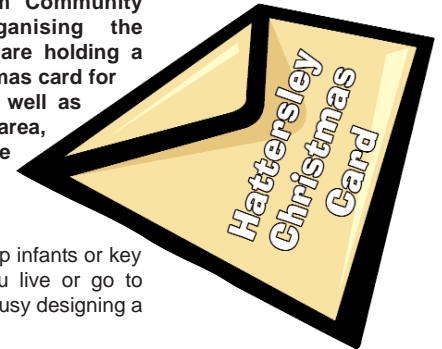

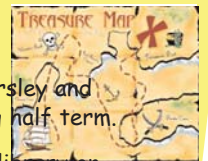

Parents, grandparents, carers and their preschool children are invited to Hattersley Library every Monday to join in with the Time for a Rhyme sessions.

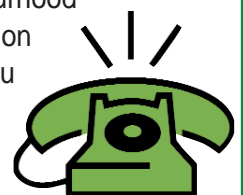

When I saw 'Mums Wanted' it made me think about the time when my children were young.

I had found it difficult with three young ones under 5 years of age. My husband worked long hours and my mum couldn't help me much as she had to look after my Gran. Sometimes the days seemed endless and it took military precision to even get out of the house, so some days I just didn't bother. I love my children but really needed some adult conversation and reassurance that I was a good parent.

Then my Health Visitor told me about Home-Start and the support I could get from a volunteer who was a parent and would visit me once a week for a couple of hours. After a telephone call along came Julie each week, we had a coffee, chatted, went out to the park or the local playgroup and all of a sudden I didn't feel so alone anymore.

As my children became older I decided I would like to become a Home-Start volunteer as well. I went on the course, which I really enjoyed and I made a lot of new friends as well.

At the tenth match at Meadowview, Lymm on the Thrush Pool, only ten anglers turned up for what is normally a favourite venue of most of the club's member.

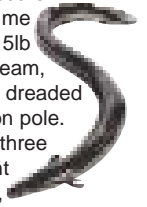
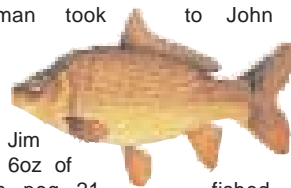
This time around first place
